Sounds-Write Program

We are excited to announce that we have been implementing the Sounds-Write program into our senior school. Sounds Write is a highly structured, systematic synthetic phonics program. The evidence-based linguistic program is recommended by AUSPELD. Sounds Write teaches students how the alphabetic code works. Fundamentally, it teaches students the key skills required to be effective readers and spellers. This is an evidence-based phonics approach which helps the children learn to read and spell effectively. Our juniors have been doing the program since early 2023 and have been progressing well.
