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

Linton Primary School participated in the National Simultaneous Storytime yesterday. Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, preschools, childcare centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. Now in its 24th successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy, using an Australian children's book that explores age-appropriate themes, and addresses key learning areas of the National Curriculum for Foundation to Year 6. This year's book is Bowerbird Blues by Aura Parker. Students loved the fact the we read the book simultaneously with over 2 million other people!

Education Week Report – Miss Walker - Space Investigation

My group looked at the maths side of STEM. We viewed the first ever Australian-made orbital rocket be raised into take off position, ready to be launched later this year. We learnt about the brothers who came up with the idea as well as the weight and size of the rocket.

Then we ventured outside to estimate and determine the distance from the Earth to the Moon, to scale. Many students were surprised to learn that the Moon is 9.5 times the circumference of the Earth away! We then had to estimate how far Mars would be away, however on our scale it would be 3 miles away! Finally, we determined the distance of the ISS, and where the Australian Built orbital rocket orbit the Earth would be.





Maths Game of the Week

Hit the Target – a calculator game!

Objective: Hit the target number before your partner does

Instructions

- 1.
- 2. Player A enters a number in the calculator that is smaller than the target number.
- Player B is challenged to add to that number to hit the target. For example if the target is 50 and Player A enters 32, if player B adds 18 they win the first round.
- If Player B misses the target, the game continues with players adding and subtracting numbers until the target is hit and the round is won.





School Saving Bonus

Dear parents and carers

You may have seen the recent announcement of the School Saving Bonus, as part of the Victorian Budget 2024/25. We are sharing more information about how families will be able to access and use this support.

This one-off support will include \$400 for each eligible student to help families cover the costs of school uniforms and activities in 2025.

It will be available to parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025.

Cash will not be paid directly to individuals or families. Instead, families will receive the bonus as credits on their school accounts that will help meet the costs of your children's activities and uniforms.

Existing supports

The School Saving Bonus support will be in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for <u>camps</u>, <u>sports</u>, <u>excursions</u> and uniforms.

The application-based <u>Affordable School Uniform program</u>, through State Schools' Relief, will continue to be available to families experiencing financial hardship or other forms of vulnerability and short-term crisis. This program allows schools to make multiple applications for support on parents' behalf throughout the year if needed.

There will be more information and guidance about the School Saving Bonus in Term 3, 2024, ahead of its implementation in 2025.
