Welcome to Term 3! What a jam-packed term we have ahead of us.

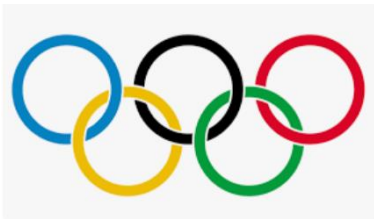

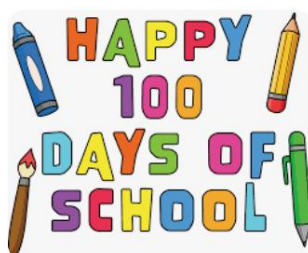


### **Art Therapy**

# Maths Game of the Week

This game can be played in pairs. To play, draw a game board (as above). You also need all of the Australian coins placed in a hat or container (One of each).

Before starting the game, nominate a coin that when chosen makes the player go 'bust.'

Taking turns, take one coin at a time out of the hat. This goes towards the players score and gets written in the coins section on the gameboard. The coins get returned and the game continues until someone chooses the nominated coin. If that happens, the player loses their score and writes zero in the total section. The players at any time may 'bank' their score believing a \$1 coin may come out next.

Play five rounds and add up the grand total at the end. E.g. \$3.80 was banked in round 1 and \$6.40 banked in round 4. Variations may include playing this game with Australian notes.
