From the Principal:




Great start!

Maths Game of the Week

5 in a Row –

This is a simple game that can be played in pairs. This supports number fluency and incorporates all operations. To play each player requires a 5X5 number board with their own numbers filled in (preferably numbers 1-50). More confident students can fill in the game board with numbers 1-100). Players require a deck of cards with the picture cards taken out (Cards 1-10). Place the deck in the middle of the table. The first player draws two cards E.g. 8 and 4. The player can add the cards, subtract the cards, multiply or divide the cards depending on what number they have on their game board. The game continues until someone makes five in a row vertically, horizontally or diagonally. If a player is unable to make a number, they can pass and gain an additional card on the next turn. E.g. $3 + 2 \times 5 = 25$.


